**Medical****Notes**

*John Carraway Hines is the earliest known relative in our family tree. The story of John C. Hines death was handed down by his widow Sarah to her children and grandchildren as follows: John was a bear hunter by occupation, and on his last bear hunt, he shot a bear while on the other side of the river. Having to drag the bear behind him in the swift current, he collapsed and died of exhaustion after reaching the near river bank. It is not known which river was the scene of this tragedy. He was 32 years old when he died leaving his 30 year old wife and four children James C. (age 12), Mary E. (age 9), John H. (age 5), and William (age 3).*

**Medical****Notes**

*Sarah was said to have been an orphan and was raised by a foster family whose name was Andrews. That may be why the name Andrews appears on her son's, William Richard's, death certificate. According to the James Caraway Hines Book, after losing her husband, John C., between 1857-1860, Sarah stayed in Pike County Alabama (near Goshen) with her four children. Sarah and her three sons John Henry, James C., and William Richard Hines all came to Texas about 1875. Her daughter Mary remained in Alabama. Their exact reason for leaving Alabama was not known, but the south during the reconstruction period following the Civil War offered little opportunity. Also, being farmers, the intrigue of rich farmland in the heart of Texas could have been a factor. In 1905, Sarah's eldest son James C. Hines had not been feeling well for some time. He visited a doctor in a neighboring town. On the long buggy ride back to the house, he told his wife Melissa Ann that the doctor had diagnosed the illness as Bright's disease (kidney failure) and that the outcome would be fatal. Two months later his mother Sarah died of a stroke at the age of seventy-five. Perhaps the grief for the loss of her eldest son, on whom she had depended for so long had weakened her hold on life. She lived with her daughter-in-law Melissa Ann at the time of her death. She was called "Little Grandma".*

**Medical****Notes**

*John Henry Hines came to Grimes County, Texas from Pike County, Alabama with his widowed mother around 1878 where they settled with his brother James who had settled there in 1875. Two years later after his marriage to Lou V. they moved from Grimes County to near by Leon County where the family lived for two years. In 1882, they left Leon County, Texas north into Indian Territory, Oklahoma and settled in the community of Wilson, located near the Marshall county line in extreme southeastern corner of what is now Carter County, Oklahoma. He and Lou V. had a large family and lived here for eighteen years. In 1900, they again moved northward, deeper into the Indian Territory, settling in what is now known as Pottawatomie County, Oklahoma near the town of Pearson. A short time later they moved near Maud. In 1913 John Henry Hines was visiting his daughter Mintie near Ada, when he died at the age of 56. The river was high and they were unable to get his body back to Oak Grove Cemetery near Asher where his wife Lou V. was eventually buried. This is the dressed up version of the reason John and Lou were buried in different cemeteries. According to Thelma Hines, Lou V. kicked John out of the house and wouldn't let him back in and he died on the way to see a doctor in Ada.*
