GOV. ROBERT TREAT(Richard) born about 1624; baptized Feb. 25,1624-5 in Pit minster, Somerset, England; died July 12,1710, aged eighty-eight (gravestone, in Milford, Conn.); married, first,---- Jane Tapp, who died the last of October,1703, aged seventy-five(gravestone,almost illegible) at Milford,where her name is spelled Treate and the daughter of Edmund Tapp, one of the founders of the Church in Milford, Aug. 22, 1639, and one of its "seven pillars"; second, Oct. 24, 1705, for her third husband, Mrs. Elizabeth Hollingsworth)Bryan , born June, 16, 1641, died Jan. 10,1705, aged sixty-eight (?sixty-five) gravestone,almost illegible)..She was the daughter of Elder Michael and Abigail Powell+ of Boston married first, Aug, 23,1659, Richard Hollingsworth: second, about 1678, Richard Bryan,'the settler and merchant of 1639. He was born in England. The inventory of her personal property, amounting to L24. Is., was presented to Probate the second Wednesday in April, 1706.

Wepowage, which received the name of Millford, Nov. 24, 1640, was purchased of the Indians Feb. 12 1639. The deed was given to four persons in trust for the Planters. among: those who came from Wethersfield was Robert Treat. His name, as well as the names of some others, does not appear among the "free planters" probably on account of his extreme youth. Ten names are recorded immediately below the "free planters" and Mr.

Treat's is the seventh on the List. At the first meeting of the planters, Nov. 20, 1639, Robert Treat, though less than sixteen years old, was one of the nine appointed to survey and lay out the lands. His name appears eighth on the list. He subsequently return to Wethersfield, and was elected ratemaler there in 1647. Soon after he removed to Milford, where he owned for some years, and there his eldest son Sameul was baptized Sept. 3, 1648, on which occasion he is recorded as belonging to the church at Wethersfield, but was received into the church at Milford, April 19, 1649, together with his wife Jane. in 1649, Edmund Tapp gave land to his son-in-law Robert Treat. Milford was early united with the New Haven Colony for greater protection against the Indians and Dutch. The town records commence -Oct.: 13, 1653, fourteen years after the settlement. The earlier

and many of the subsequent records are lost. Mr. Treat is said to have Held the office of Town Clerk in 1640, though there is no record of this. Governor Treat is commonly said to have had twenty- one children, but there is no foundation to this statement. The mistake probably arose from counting the children

of his son and grandson Robert as his. In his will, dated Jan. 5, 1707, he mentions only seven,-- -Samuel, John, Mary, Robert, Hannah, Joesph and Abigail. See Lambert's History of the Colony of New Haven, pp. 85-160, for an account of Milford, and a sketch of Governor Treat. It also contains a view of his house, on lot 35, plan of Milford, p. 93, and a fac-simile of his autograph, and the seal used by him, on p. 138. But scant justice has as yet been done to the memory of Governor Treat. Many years ago. Henry Champion, of New Haven, to whose widow, Sarah Elizabeth Champion, I am under very great obligations, prepared a most excellent paper on the Life and Character of Robert Treat, which was before the New Haven Historical Society, Sept. 25, 1865. This paper have printed. I have also added an article which I had prepared long before I knew of Mr. Champion's paper, as it contains many things upon which he

has touched but lightly or not at all. Both papers are the results of independent investigation. We know nothing of the early history of Robert Treat. That he must have been well educated may be inferred from the fact that though he was not a college-bred man, he was familiar with Latin, and sometimes makes use of it in his Letters, as is in one to: Fitz-John Winthrop, - who succeeded him as Governor of the Colony, and with whom he was on terms of the closest intimacy- dated Aug. 17, 1700, "sperare PM timer." Mass. Hist. Coll. ,6th Series, Vol. 3, Winthrop Papers, Part V, p 57; also in a letter to Winthrop, dated April 7, 1702, "my utinam," IB. p. 90. He was then nearly eighty years old.

There is a tradition that he was an inmate of the household of Rev. Mr. Prudden, the first minister at Milford. If so, perhaps it was once the intention to educate Robert Treat for the ministry.

VORACIOUS EATERS

Among the many accounts of pioneer life among the old timers of Marion County Arkansas is the following told me by Capt. Curtis Rea who died at Oakland on the 29 of March 1907. " As regards my hunting experience I have no stories to give you. True I have killed a few deer but I never met my trouble with a buck or wild beast. My inclinations was not toward hunting. I took more delight in breaking unruly cattle to work or ride a wild horse than hunt for game; however I will tell you a story that may be of some interest. Some years after my father John C. Rea settled in Rea Valley below Yellville a family of the name of Treat came into our section from the state of Indiana. This family consisted of several members. The men of which were large and exceeding stout weighing from 250 to 300 pounds each. Two brothers of them Steve and Billy Treat one day at Buffalo City is said to have lifted a hogshead of sugar weighing 1200 pounds and put it on a wagon. I am told that Steve Treat held up a 40 gallon barrel full of liquor by the chimes and drank whiskey from the bung hole. The Treats had voracious appetites and eat with raging hunger. They were so ravenous that it took enormous amounts of food to satisfy their appetites. They were the greatest eaters I ever saw. I was told that Steve Treat once consumed at one sitting 15 big biscuits and drank ten cups of coffee and got away with other victuals in proportion. I do not know whether the Treats belonged to the Confederate Army or not. If they did I can account for our rations being so scarce for they devoured it and left the remainder of us to starve to death almost. One day Berry Treat informed me that he and John Treat went to the Buffalo mountains together to hunt and on the evening of the first day out they killed a yearling bear that was fat and two yearling deer that was in fine condition and after removing the hides and dressing the meat they carried it to camp where there was a fine spring of water and made a fire and began to fill up on broiled and fried bear and venison until the following morning when they had consumed all three of the animals except the hides and bones."

Panther
Calling up a Panther

The following narrative was given me by Captain A. S. Wood of Kingdom springs, Marion County Arkansas, and shows the dangers and risks hunters underwent while north Arkansas was infested with panthers. Captain Wood related an account of In exciting adventure of Steve Treat who then

Lived in Madison County, Arkansas. Berry Treat, his brother, lived on Buffalo. Steve was a robust healthy man and a ravenous eater. he appeared to be always hungry. "A few years after the occurrence I am going to relate to you," said Captain Wood, "Steve Treat removed to Crooked Creek seven miles below Yellville. While living here, he went to Yellville one day and purchased a side of bacon and started home with it. But it is told that he got so hungry before he reached home that he stopped and devoured the entire side of bacon before appeasing his appetite. Whether this is correct or not, I am not going to say, but I was told it was true. When he lived in Madison County he went to Buffalo on a visit to see his brother Berry Treat. While there he would hunt during the day and remain over night at his brother's house. Steve delighted to hunt and Lost no time killing all the game he could." "Treat

possessed a peculiar homemade instrument that he used in calling up deer. He had made it of wood and a piece of tin end called it his 'blater' because the noise made on it resembled the bleating of a fawn so closely that an expert hunter could hardly distinguish it from the bleating of a real fawn. One day while he was rambling around in the creek bottom in search of game he sat down on the end of a log to rest. He had hunted several hours for game that day but failed to find anything worth shooting. He had no dog with him and depended on his eyes, ears and 'blater' to discover game. He was tired and he wanted to rest his weary self on the log and blate for a deer with his 'blater.'" "So after seating himself on the log he applied the device to his mouth and began calling for a deer. He blew on it several minutes but not a deer responded. He went on blowing his 'blater,' stopping at short intervals to watch and listen for the approach of game, but he could not see or hear anything coming. This was strange, for he knew the valley of Buffalo River was over-run with deer. As he went on bleating and listening he heard a slight noise nearby. At this a delightful thought struck him, for he supposed it was a doe coming on the hunt for her fawn. When he turned his head to see the deer, he was startled at the sight of a panther crouched on the other end of the log swaying its tail and crawling toward him. The hunter dropped his 'blate' instantly and quickly turned the muzzle of his rifle toward the stealthy form of the panther and aimed at its head and pulled the trigger. A sharp report rang out and a leaden ball buried itself between the eyes, crushing the skull and bursting both eye balls out, and the huge panther rolled off the Log to the ground and died without a struggle. The dreaded animal was just in the act of springing on him when he fired at it. But the fatal bullet from the unerring rifle put an end to its career."

FLIPPIN PRICE TREAT FAMILY

Best Ozark families had "tough sledding" in early lives. The Treat family was no exception through it all, however, many laughable thing occurred, at least they are Funny today. I grew up in the Big Rat area (Searcy Co. line). Most families were big -- 10 to 12 Supply manpower For the farm. because of the needs of that day and lack funds, Dad finally got to start to school after a few years and a Few 3-month terms, he took his teacher exams and passed. In his early he taught school at Landis and and other schools around Big Flat. When he began his term at Landis (summer school), he came upon lady and her two brothers, John and Sam Sutterfield, with their dress and pants legs roll

catching bumpies with a cull stave fish trap spying the shapely gams(probably ankles), he immediately pledged to marry Della and raise her up to suit himself

He didn't know Della as well as the brothers, would be in his classes the next day. At the end of a term, Dad and Mother married; he was 26 and she was 17.

Their first night was spent, as expected, at Grandpa Treat's. This was called an "Infract" in those days. Dad and Mother lived several years on a farm

at Capps Fork, where he also ran a cotton gin and sawmill. During that time, my sisters, Atha and lone, and brother, Howard, were born. Howard was always bigger and stronger than I. But then, he got an earlier and bigger start. He weighed in at 13 Ibs., while I barely hit 5 Ibs. Dad moved to Landis about 1916 to "Young Holler." The house was a two-room log house connected with a dog run, in 1917, I was to be born and Dr. Branscum was called. Ralph, as usual, was in a hurry, and was born before the Dr. got there. They tell me I was dropped on my head on the hearth. While Dad was in the process of building a new frame house, we moved to the Henderson Lawrence Farm, now Georgia Lawrence farm. I was about a three-year old water boy. On one occasion Dad and the hired man were working in the field and sent me to the house for a pail of water. On the way, a blue racer chased me up the gate and held me there till I was rescued. When the new house was being built, I remember Uncle Robert Sutterfield was the construction foreman. It took a lot of tobacco juice to finish it.

My sister, Madge, came along and Mother would let me watch her "suckle." Mother would tease me about how pretty she was. After moving into the new house, Dad tore down the old log house. He and Mother sawed up the logs into cook stove wood. One day while they were sawing wood, brother Howard, sister

Madge, and I held down the log. Howard reached Forward and pulled my shoulder back which threw my feet up under the saw. After a couple of whacks, they stopped and found the saw had cut across the instep severing at least one tendon. It has never bothered me and all I have is a fond memory of happy young days. In 1923 Dad moved to Marshall where I started to school in "Old Main." Dad took me to school the first day. It was raining, and the "big boys" were throwing mud balls, one of which hit me in the eye. I didn't think much of school. During those years I remember having Capitola Johnston, Mrs. Lockwood, Leonila Jones, Oarner Rodgers, Nobe Henley, and Veda Clemons

as teachers. Mary Rose Treat Wright and Samuel Price Treat were born in Marshall in the booming 20's. Later in the 20's, when everything went "bust," we moved back to "Young Holler." My most fond memories of Dad is his honesty, a lesson I have remembered all my life. My most fond memories of Mother is her natural abilities as a seamstress and her needle work. She could look at a piece of crochet work and duplicate it. A few years before her death, at age 86, we ordered a pattern and nylon thread to make a large table spread (crocheted). Nylon is stiff and slippery but she kept at it. She finally finished it after working a total of 1600 hours! We have this masterpiece today. I don't see how anyone could have had a Better example than we had with Mother and Dad. Written by Ralph Treat

When Frank Treat (8-3-1892 - 5-6-1985) son of George and Mary E. Sisk Treat, married Attie Lawrence (2-1-1901 - 7-28-1992), daughter of Henderson S. and Rosa Farris Lawrence on 4-16-1917, life took them through two world wars, a depression, two major military

conflicts and seeing man on the moon.

Beginning their life on a Searcy County farm, they decided to go where they could find work for wages--Oklahoma cotton fields. They went by train and returned by wagon, crossing the Arkansas River on a pontoon bridge lying on the surface of the water.

Their next venture came after they had four children, Mable, Vernon, Ferrel and Leeman. This time it was Arizona vegetable harvest. While in Arizona, two of the children were infected with the dreaded small pox, but recovered promptly.

Leaving Arizona they moved to Colorado vegetable harvest, staying about six month.

Searcy county farming didn't prove fruitful. When WW II began, they with their sons, daughter and in-laws, moved to Illinois to work in the timber, soon the three boys were drafted and sent to Europe. Leeman, the youngest was captured by the Germans, and by a twist of fate, Frank was a Forman over German POW's in the U.S. Frank being a believer in "do unto others...", felt compassion for the POW's; they weren't getting enough food to give them strength for hard manual labor that was required. It was against war time law to buy food for them, but was alright to share his food, so Franks lunches increased considerable and nothing was ever left over. When Leeman was liberated, Franks POW crew rejoiced with him.

Between the war years and retirement came with comforts Frank and Attie couldn't have imagined they started out with barest necessities in 1917. The death of Vernon, on 10-20-1979 was the dark time for them.

In sixty-eight years they shared all things. They were blessed with devoted children, and their families. Frank was ninety-two when he died. Attie was ninety-one when she died in Marshall at her daughters.

I thought that was cool and at that time, a quarter would actually buy some candy or gum! The other thing I remember is one time Pa-pa voted for a Democrat, Dale Bumpers I think, for governor of Arkansas. Pa-pa and Poppie were discussing the election and when Pa-pa told Poppie he'd voted democrat, Poppie got sooo mad. This was the first time I'd ever seen anyone get upset about politics so I guess you could say Poppie taught me how passionately some folks feel about the subject! My Poppy Treat

I remember many good times with Poppy. He was gruff man with to a lot of people but, when I was around 12 he had just got his 1960 Green Buick I wanted to wash it, they lived under the hill in Marshall. He let me drive it around the side of the house to wash it. When I had finished I started to back it backwards around the house but, it wouldn't move backward. He got in and drove it around the front of the house and to the garage to have it fixed. He didn't get mad or say anything. He knew I was upset by my crying. He came back and told me it wasn't my fault they had left something out when they made the car.

I can remember setting the buzzer to buzz at the lowest speed he would start driving and it would go off. Poppy would act surprised and wonder how it would have gotten set down there. It is a wonder he could even see out the window we played filling station and washed the windows with soap and newspaper.

I can also remember him sitting on the porch at Bobo's and telling me if he had it to do over he would not change a thing he found the best woman ever made to share his life with--Gloria Jean Treat Kinkade

I have a couple of memories of Poppy that stand out to me. My very first

memory of ever eating in a restaurant was with Mom and Poppy. I have no idea where we were or who else was with us, I know that I was very young, and just barely remember this, but we were going somewhere in Poppy's car, and he was hungry and wanted to stop and get something to eat. We went in a restaurant, and I don't know what anybody ordered, except that we all had blackberry cobbler for desert, and I can remember Poppy talking about how good it was. I think he must have liked to eat in restaurants, because I can remember several times in my life being out with him and going somewhere to eat. I think he's probably responsible for me liking to eat out so well now. I also remember when we lived at Plainview sitting on the porch and listening to Poppy sing. He loved to sing, and he always sang out of a church hymn book and used one hand to direct the music. I would sit on the steps of mom and Poppy's house and listen to him. He would sit in a straight-back chair on the porch and sing, and I really thought he could sing pretty. I can remember Frankie and me riding with him when we were very small and singing with him, and he told us we were really good singers. It made both of us feel really important---Patricia Ann Treat Pemberton

Well I declare Attie" are probably the four most used words by Poppy. How do you describe him, his gruff exterior, his love for his grandchildren, his always willing to help others, his love of fishing. Poppy had just bought his new green Buick and had put new nylon and plastic seat covers over the cloth seats. He took me to the café in Plainview for a hamburger and while he was in the café I proceeded to burn holes in the seat covers with the cigarette lighter. I should have got my bottom fanned, but Poppy just gave me a good talking to.

I once asked Poppy if he had it to do over would he marry Mommy again. His response "I'd marry Attie twice if I had too. I've been well pleased with Attie." Although he was not one to show his affection too often, Mother told about how loving he was when the news came that Uncle Leeman was a prisoner of war, then when Uncle Vernon died I saw it with my own eyes, many times he came to ask if she was ok and to put his arm around her.

Some things that I have learned is that Poppy ran a work camp for German prisoners during the war. He took food from their home to feed them with because he felt the government food rations were not enough for working men. This would take a mighty big person, when I'm sure his own son was not treated with compassion.

His faith in other people, loaning a man who was a total stranger money to start a photography business because the man had been robbed on his way home from the service. This faith was well placed as the man later repaid the money.

I remember his row boat that probably rotted away from the rain, because I never remember that it was ever in the water. Probably more fishing was done on dry land by the grandchildren than was ever done in the water by Poppy.

You never asked Poppy to buy certain items as you would never know his response. Once I asked him to buy some deodorant, only to hear that it wasn't necessary and a waste of money. After embarrassing the daylights out of me he ended up saying get it if you really think you need it.

I also remember him taking us to the church revivals. For those of you who don't know what a revival is I'll try to explain. The churches used to put up some strings of lights and set out benches, then a visiting preacher would come for a few days and preach at night. I can remember that Poppy many times led the singing (no piano or music of any kind). I can still hear him do the scales to start the singing.

I still miss both Mom and Poppy, but I am so thankful that they we had them in our lives.

This is kinda hard for I don't know much about Poppy. I can still hear him when there was other people around, he would argue with anyone whom would argue back. He and Daddy would really get after it and I doubt if either one was right. I do remember how he liked to hunt and fish. He always had a good story to tell about the biggest fish he caught. Mom Treat always had to have supper on the table by 6:00, I can remember one thing he had to say about supper time, but won't tell it. Really wish we were around Poppy and Mom Treat more than we were. I nearly forgot the time I was riding with them and Mom Treat wanted to stop for a hamburger, Poppy didn't think she needed one. He did stop to get hamburgers and Mom Treat only wanted one hamburger and he laughed at her then ordered her 3 hamburgers. He laughed all the way to Plainview while Mom Treat was trying to eat them all. Nearly made her sick, but he wasn't going to get away with that. Okay that's all folks...Janet Lee Treat Yates

What I remember most about Poppy Treat was how he would "Rant and Rave" when I would ask him to borrow his car. He would always give me a lecture on how cars and things were ruining people. He would always let me know him and mom didn't have a car to go places when they were dating. After a half hour of this evertime i asked for it he would always let me have it. I would have to build up the courage to ask him for it though. Billy Treat

Poppy Treat was a diverse individual, he was a believer in the scriptures, a respecter of his women folks and older people, he wasn't so macho that he couldn't cry if one of his own (Mom Treat especially) was hurt or in trouble...his feathers could also be ruffled, mostly about politics, religion or a disrespectful attitude, we knew that had happened when we heard him say, in his very gruffiest voice, "I'll just declare!" or "I'll just swan"..which was as near to profanity as I ever heard from Poppy...he was generous but never made a public show of it...when I would come home on vacation and was getting ready to go back , he always made sure that I had a "few" extra dollars so I could have something "to eat on"...Truth to tell, I'll bet all of us have gotten some of those "few" extra dollars or the equivalent there of, for something or other he thought we needed.

These are my fun memories of Poppy. Oh yeah, Poppy could be fun!

When we lived in Illinois, all of the families were having dinner at Mom and Poppy's house and for some reason (heaven only knows what WE could have done) we youngsters were getting scolded by the women, Poppy told them to let us kids alone, we were only young once! That bit of wisdom made him my hero forever.

Did you know Poppy liked to swim and had as much fun as us kids paddling around in the water and for those of us who couldn't swim, he would swim with us on his back.

He liked to play, or should I say play with, the guitar. He would take a butter knife and slide it down the strings as he plucked out the chords...Sounded great to me!!!

He helped Ray with his algebra, and got the right answer, even though he didn't work it like the teacher had said too. We were so very proud of him!

Did you know Poppy could make biscuits? He could, and they tasted just as good as any biscuits. Perhaps a little strange looking, they were about as round as a jar lid, but extremely tall!!! He would place them very close in the pan and they had no way to go but UP!!! Why Poppy was making biscuits is a whole 'nother story...

Poppy was not a good baby-sitter!!!! I left Dale with him for a few minutes and told him to take the bottle out of his mouth when it got empty, when I got back, Dale was sucking on that empty bottle, happy as a little lark and Poppy was looking down the creek to see what was going on...

I loved to listen to Poppy tell about his early days and of his hunting experiences...sometime he'd get the buck and sometimes he didn't...One of his stories that can still gives me the shivers was of the man that was bitten by a rabid dog and the terrible ordeal of the man finally going mad!!!! Then there was the man that had gotten bitten, but someone had a madstone to put on the bite and this man survived...Don't know what a madstone is??? Ask Google, it's much too complicated for me to explain...When you ask Google, ask for, deer madstone...it come from the stomach of the deer..

When the grandchildren picked strawberries for Poppy, we always got paid more than the regular field hands and if we had friends come to help, he would pay them the same as he did us..

In the late 1940s when Poppy's boys were all home from the war..he and his young sons would play Pitch (oh yes, Poppy did play cards at one time) and discuss, very loudly, whose truck had the most power!!!...I watched in them in amazement as they became louder and louder!!! Then Mom Treat would step in and tell them to, "Hush"!...

I really enjoyed reading all of them and am sure you will too and they will probably bring more memories to mind, I know they did for me. Especially Krista's telling about when Poppy and Mom were notified that Leeman was missing in action...that was the first time I saw Poppy cry...I was looking out the window when I saw two men, one on either side of Poppy holding him up, because he was crying so hard...it was a frightening sight for a little girl..then I remembered the packages Mom Treat packed to send Leeman and can remember the smell of the toothpowder and the Life Buoy soap she put in them.

Gloria Jean Treat Kinkade: My favorite memories at Mom Treat's are many. I think the funniest was when they lived under the hill at Marshall. We were having strawberry short cake. It was when they had just come out with Ready Whip in the can. Mommy was fixing the cakes and couldn't get it to spray out. She tilted it up a little and low and behold it sprayed right into Poppy's face. Well I declare Attie; and the laughter began everybody but Poppy laughed.

As for the food It was all good as I remember. The best was her Blackberry Cobbler of course coleslaw was at the top too.

Patricia Ann Treat Pemberton: I remember so well how Mom could get plants and bushes to grow in her yard. She told me one time that you didn't need roots, just stick them in the ground, add a little water, and they would grow. Well, I tried it several times without roots and it never worked for me. I guess my favorite food was her beans. I remember how she always mixed white beans and pintos, cooked them all day long, and they were so delicious. She gave me instructions for cooking them when I got married, but mine never tasted like hers.

Pallets were everywhere and after she and Poppy went to sleep we would sneak in and get a few Cokes out for refreshment. Favorite foods, fruit cobbles, cocoa gravy, and her famous yellow cake. No recipe but the frosting was always the sticky weepy meringue. How I wish the younger grandbabies could have spent time there. Blackberry picking, wading in the creek, playing paper dolls, and just roaming the farm at Big Flat or down on Long Creek.

Sherri Pemberton Conrad: I don't really have a "food" memory of Mom. The only real memory

I have of her before they moved in with Mabel was that Tracey and I spent the night with mom and poppy once. That night, she let us play in her closets digging through all of her clothes and jewelry. She even gave us both a couple of her hats from the late 20's or so. I do remember she cooked a BIG breakfast the next morning, but I have no idea what it was! I know I enjoyed the sleepover though. She played with us like she was a kid too!

Kathryn Elaine Treat Watts: I only remember patches of this - but I think of it everytime I think of

Mom Treat so it must be one of my favorites. I believe it was Krista, Jean, LaGatha and myself. We were at Mable's and we were seeing who could climb

the highest. Well, Mom Treat stacked coffee cans (I believe) in a chair and tried to climb on top of them, which if I remember right she did. We got so tickled at her. My favorite foods would probably be her White and Pinto beans mixed and her cole slaw. Mom Treat was always fun to be around. She was mischievous!!!!

Obeta Honeycutt Wyckoff: I remember that when Mom Treat got her hands on a bucket of paint, everything was painted that color, be it bed springs, picture frames or flower pots...everything!!! My favorite food was her chocolate pie...the meringue was weepy and sticky, the filling was so firm that it cracked, but it was so GOOD (after I scooped the meringue off). I also remember eating those big sugar cookies that Donald Lee was telling about.

LaGatha Vern Treat: I remember Mom Treat's wonderful breakfasts with pork chops and chocolate gravy, but my favorite food was her brown beans and cole slaw. Not very many days go by that I don't think of them. I also remember how she used to rub Suave Lotion all over her. I do mean all over, even her hair. I loved that smell then and still do. I have a lot of good memories of times spent at Long Creek when Mama and Daddy would go to the cotton patch and leave Kathy and me over there. Times were always fun, especially if Obeta was there. But, my very best memories are of the times that Krista Kay, Donald Lee, and I stayed with Mom after they moved down under the hill at Marshall. I will not mention the antics here because I am sure they have been told and retold! Why did she let all of us stay at the same time??? I appreciated Mom Treat's sense of humor, character, determination, and sense of oral history. One of my favorite memories is of spending time with Mom Treat at old cemeteries where she knew who everybody was even if there was no stone. She told endless stories of these people, and I believe it was here that my love for history and family roots took growth. I wish I had told her that. I love all of my family and you are all in my memories more than you will ever know!

Billy Wayne Treat: My favorite memory of Mom Treat was getting to go to her house for dinner. SHE ALWAYS HAD PORK CHOPS. I THOUGHT THAT WAS THE BEST MEAT IN THE WORLD AND I STILL DO. I GUESS WHEN I WAS A KID that was the only time I ever had one. Also they always had the small bottles of coke. I thought they were the best things. Poppy would only let me have one a day but Mom would always let me have another one, but not tell Poppy. The second one always tasted much better. You know how kids are.
