He was born to Perlee and Eunice (Hazard) Beverly. The history of the Horace Beverly family states that he was born in New York State, place not given. He received a somewhat limited education in his native state. At the age of 19 he commenced life for himself by working in the lumbering woods and finally came to Michigan in 1853. He was then, 24 years old. He worked as a miller and a farmer. He married in 1852 at the age of 23 to Sabrina S. Tallmadge.

In 1862 he enlisted in Company B, ninth Michigan infantry under General Sherman and was never off duty for even one day, (except while a prisoner) from the time he entered the services until his honorable discharge at Detroit in 1865. He was captured at Spring hill Tenn. in 1863 and was in Libby Prison for 19 days. He is a member of Chauncey Bassett Post, No. 56. G.A.R. of Allegan and is a republican. He was clerk of Pine Plains Township as well as the popular Postmaster of Mill Gove and served as Justice of the Peace for 8 years. Besides filling most of the township offices. He was a devout member of the Odd fellows Lodge No. 105, I.O.O.F of Allegan, The Encampment and the Regaled Cantons.

He was a progressive citizen of Allegan County. His sympathies were quick, and ever on the side of the right as he perceived it, his generous heart and unflinching integrity are among his chief characteristics.

Sarah was a homemaker in Grand Haven. She was widow with two children, Alice Sabrina my mother, and my uncle Lee Ferris Wynne. Her husband passed away in 1917 when Alice was 11 years old and Lee was 9. Before my grandma gave birth to my mom, and before her husband passed away near where they lived on Second Street in Grand Haven, a small newborn baby boy was left there on the doorstep. They adopted him and his name was Lee Ferris Wynne. His childhood did not consist of very good memories of Grand Haven. He could never understand up to the day of his death, WHY people who resided here continued to call him the doorstep baby. No one could ever forget his early childhood adoption.

Sarah Married Capt. Ed Martin in 1919. He had two sons, Roland and Clinton. Capt. Martin was well known in Grand Haven and Muskegon as he was the Captain of the Carferry Milwaukee that went in and out of the channel here and also Muskegon. His two sons followed in his footsteps as Roland became a captain and Clinton at one time, a first mate. He was very proud of each of them.

Combining their families, they now had four children, all pretty close in age. The Martin and Wynne kids all went through school together here in Grand Haven. Lee, whom everyone call Ferris, graduated and left for CA. He graduated from USC and became a Dentist in Hollywood. He was married five times and out of those marriages, he had one son, His son, Anthony Wynne resides in Lemon Grove, CA, is an accomplished pianist and is single. Tony came in 1971 when Ferris died and that's the last we saw him. Over the years I've spoken with Tony's mom Laura and in 1989, Ken and I stopped to see her in Lemon Grove California.

Clinton and Roland were very close to Sarah and visited often in Grand Haven. Thier father had custody of them as their mother had left them in early childhood years. So Sarah was a pretty important person to the both of them. They treated her so wonderful as she did them.

Sarah and Ed went to FL. each year after he retired and in 1947 on their way down they ran into a terrible snowstorm. The roads were not cleared and he slid down an embankment and totaled the car. My mom, dad and I went to New Albany, Indiana, stayed for four days before she died. She had been in a coma for 5 days, never knowing we were all there with her. Ferris came from California, Roland and Clint came from Milwaukee. According to the obituary, Capt Martin was driving when the car skidded down a long hill. The car went over an embankment and hit a tree. The impact threw Sarah against the dash board where she was unconscious. She died from a brain injury after all efforts were exhausted at the hospital.

When they wintered in Florida and would return in the springtime, that was always a happy time for me because they would bring shells and always a new dress for me. They lived upstairs at 215 Lafayette and I thought I was the luckiest person in the world to have their grandparents living in the same house! We did lots of things together, she taught me at a young age how to tat, knit, and crochet. She loved to make pretty quilts, but none of those talents she had rubbed off on me.

Captain Edward E. Martin was born on Beaver Island. His parents were Edward Martin and Grace Malloy. They had taken up a homestead on the Island after the departure of the Mormons following the murder of King Strang. The Martin brothers, seven in number, had left Westport County Mayo Ireland to find a better life in the U.S. They landed in PA or New York and two of the brothers settled there. The other five Including Edward, Traveled down the Mississippi River where they found work on the barges that towed upstream by horses. They heard the fishing was good on the Great Lakes and eventually worked their way to Mackinaw Island. They were soon in their natural way of life, being fishermen. They fished all the waters of Northern Lake Michigan in their "Mackinaw" sail boats. After the Mormons were removed from Beaver Island, all five Martin Brothers took up homesteads there. Grandfather Martin settled on the east side at Sand Bay, cleared the land, built a log cabin and barns, and built a boathouse and net shed on the beach. He both farmed and fished as did his brothers. They took Thier fish to market at St. James, about ten miles away. Great Grandpa Martin married Grace Malloy (who came from Aran Mor county Donegal Ireland) on Mackinaw Island. They had three sons and three daughters. Daniel, Edward and John, Grace, Anna and Katherine. John was not born when their father drowned while trying to save his nets in a storm that suddenly came up. It was so sad because Grace was pregnant with John and was on the shore and watched this happen. The going was really tough without the breadwinner, the children worked hard at an early age. Dan and Ed, 16 and 14 managed to caulk and repair their dad's boat and nets, and began fishing. It was around this time that the boys met Dan Coffey from Manistique. He offered them employment on the steam tugs. They then left the island and went to Manistique. Their ambitions at that age came to the attention of the Manager of the Chicago Lumber Company, Henry Wickwires father. When the boys explained they wanted to build a home for their mother and family, Wickwire not only loaned them the lumber, but arranged for the purchase of the land and supervision of their effort. They built the home on Garden Avenue and sent for their mother, and at last, the family was all together.

Dan eventually shipped out on one of the boats that docked in Manistique. Edward continued fishing for Coffey and during closed season, would work in the lumber camps, or ship out. Coffey sent his tugs to Lake of the Woods and Lake Superior when the fishing was poor on Lake Michigan. It was at this time that Ed met the telephone operator, Frances Malloy. They married and returned to Manistique when the fishing ended. Thier son Roland was born on the 13th of July 1904 and their second son Clinton was born six yeas later. When Ed was laid off he shipped as a Wheels man on the Manistique, Marquette and the Northern # 1 carferry, running between Manistique and Northport. He moved at that time to Northport because the ship had more lay in time there. This venture did not prove a success and in 1908, the ship was sold to the Grand Trunk Milwaukee Carferry Company and operated out of Grand Haven and Milwaukee. Ed stayed with the ship and soon sent for his family to live in Grand Haven. He never had the chance for schooling, wanting to become a licensed deck Offer, he then learned to read and write. Within a short time, he took the exam and passed. Capt. Lyman helped him and put him on as Second Mate of the ship, which had been re-named the City of Milwaukee. He was transferred as first mate to Grand Haven in 1910. He held that position until 1918 when he became the Master. He served on her until his retirement in 1937. Ed and Frances had been divorced when she left him and their sons in about 1911. He married Sarah Beverly Wynne on December 17, 1918 when Roland was 14 and Clint just 8 years old. She was a widow with two small children, Alice and Ferris who were both 8 also, they then combined their families. They wintered in Florida each year after everyone had left the nest, and in 1947 en route there, he skidded off the icy road near New Albany Indiana and went down a steep embankment . Both he and Sarah were severely injured and

she died six days later. At the scene of the accident, her watch and ring were stolen off of her. He said that the only people who touched her before the ambulance and police got there were the road commission men. He never got over someone removing those gifts he had given her many years before. He also was very worried about the money they had for their Florida vacation, but my mother had sewn pockets in the girdle that Sarah wore, and when we got to the hospital down there, she went right into the closet and found the money, perfectly intact!. He made his home at that time with his step daughter and family, Alice and Gunnard Oslund, in Grand Haven at 215 Lafayette. He was a lonely man after she died as they were such a sweet couple together. He had a brand new Studebaker car and when Wynne was at Western Michigan going to College, my folks would drive down there about every other Sunday to see him. Grandpa and I would go to the Grand Haven Beach and he would let me drive that car around and around the Oval. It was a stick shift and I'd jerk it every time I let out the clutch.....but he was SO patient. After awhile I got so good, he would let me drive to the cemetery from home and then out and around the beach. Of course I was no where near old enough to get my license and I often wonder if my folks knew what grandpa and I were doing when they left. He also loved to pick blueberries, blackberries out at the cemetery. It was sort of a trade off, I'd help him pick berries for my mother, and then I could drive the car. HE was SO Good to me throughout my early life. Even when Ken and I were married, he bought us numerous things for our wedding. He was such a kind man and had SO many friends. When Ken and I moved back to Grand Haven from Detroit in 1961, he would push our small son Scott downtown in his stroller, he loved taking him to the Children's store and getting a new outfit for him. He called Scott, Sandy. He would go over to Milwaukee and spend some time during the winter months with Roland and family. He became ill in 1961 and went to Muskegon where his son, Rol and VI lived. He died August 11, 1962. He was laid to rest at Lake Forest Cemetery next to Sarah in Grand Haven Michigan. My parents are buried there also as is Lee Ferris, Ken's parents, and Roland and Viola.

Lena attended the Mill Grove school in her early years and she went to High School in Allegan She married Orson Carmi Coburn December 27, 1899 at the Allegan Methodist Church. They were married by Rev. Griffin. They began housekeeping in Allegan and after a few months, they bought a small home on North Street. This information is what Orson himself typed in a large family journal he put together. Bless him for doing that! Lena and Orson were wonderful people and I remember so well going to their home numerous times during my early childhood years. They had a darling home in Allegan and it was always a joy to see them both. Oh the joys of youth.....

Notes for ORSON CARMI COBURN:

Orson and Lena lived on the main street in Allegan. It was a really nice home and it was down the street from the Allegan Elks Club. I remember going there so many times as I grew up. When we would have family get togethers we would go there too. I also remember riding down there with my grandma and grandpa a few times because Lena was my grandmothers niece. Capt. and Sarah had a lot of fun with Orson and Lena. Over the years, the Coburns/Dennis/Lampmans would have picnics in Kalamazoo, Otsego and other places and we would always be invited. They were a warm and caring couple and it was always a pleasure to see them. He was

ALWAYS dressed up in a tie/white shirt, or a cardigan sweater and that's what I remember most about Orson was how nice he always looked. The following information about Orson comes from the journal he wrote and gave to his children. He moved to Allegan at an early age and went to school in the "old" North Side School, a two story wooden structure. Two teachers were employed, Miss Emma Holton taught upstairs, grades five and sixth, and Miss Jennie Langley taught downstairs the beginners through the fourth grade. Orson later attended the Old Seminary on the hill. After a short time there, he quit school and took a job at the Allegan Journal, a weekly newspaper and after about a year there, he took a position with the Allegan Gazette. He worked there over 40 years, until 1936 when the business was sold. He writes in this wonderful legacy journal that he left for his children, these are his words. "Since the passing of my dear wife I have made my home in Hollywood California with my son Bill and Peggy. I return to Michigan every June, visiting with my other three children, then return to Hollywood the latter part of August. I have become acquainted with many members of our Congregational church, also the Salvation Army here, (places that we attend regularly) also at the West L.A. Methodist church where Wm. is the organist and choir director. I also have become acquainted with some very nice elderly men in our park where I go often for visits and card-playing. I have taken many enjoyable trips with Peg and Bill on their musical concerts, North, South East and West in the state of California. I've gone to Michigan by car several times, four times I've flown in a Jet Plane, planning again this coming June for another Michigan trip. By putting his genealogy program together as good as he could remember it, he hopes that some member of the family will keep it going and enter more. At the time of his writing, it was 1965, he states he had 4 children, 11 grandchildren and 22 GREAT grandchildren and he expects to have many more in the next 100 years. He signed it My Love to ALL, and may God Bless you all, Your old father, grandfather and great-grandfather." What a artwork piece he wrote! Thanks Orson for doing such a complete job and today, 2005, I'm trying to catch it up for the next generation!

Notes for GUNNARD PETER OSLUND:

In my growing up years, my dad worked at Oldberg Manufacturing. He worked there for many years and I think when I started high school in the 9th grade, he went into business with Jerry Botbyl out on the East End where they purchased a building and it was called Grand Office Supply. They ran that for many years until they decided to make it into a Furniture Store. In 1959, dad had sold the business to Jerry on a promissory note and before the ink was dry on the note, Jerry died very suddenly of a heart attack. He was about 12 years younger than my dad, and Millie, Jerry's wife tried to operate the store but in time, it became my parents again. At that time, my mother and him put everything they had into it. Working all the hours themselves and enjoyed being together. He was a very laid back man kept to himself, a shy person around people he didn't know. He was a wonderful father to my brother and I, and I never remember him raising his voice or disciplining me in a mean manner. Mom and him had lots of friends and they were involved at that time in the Elks. They loved to go to dinner dances there and usually ended up at Larry and Ruth VanEsselt's house closing the Elks. He had a heart attack in 1961 and that really took the wind out of his sails. He was driving to the store and had severe chest pains. I had just had Rory and we lived a few blocks away from them at that time. He pretty much laid low after that, spending less and less time at the store. Both Wynne and I helped mom in the store when we could and then it was decided that they should put it up for sale. Paul Matthews, a salesman that called on them often, purchased it. In 1964 Ken and I bought the big house at 215, and they moved across into the small bungalow they had owned for years at 222 Lafayette. That's the home they resided in until mom died in 1981 and he in 1982. They spent many winters in Florida although they never stayed the length of time that they paid for, as they'd get so homesick, and soon would return. After mom died in "81", he cried every day for her and missed her so much. He visited the cemetery twice daily and really wished that he could join her. His heart gave him lots of problems but we know it was the stress of working himself up into a spell that caused those heart problems. He wore a nitro patch on his arms,

putting it one day on one and the following day on the other. This helped the pain that he would get in his arm, which was caused from the undo stress he would put himself through. The day before Valentines day the following year after she died, just nine months later, he had another massive heart attack and died on that Saturday, Feb. 13th. He is buried next to mom at Lake Forest. Had they lived until 1982, they would have celebrated their 50th and Wynne and I would have celebrated our 25th anniversary. We both celebrated ours that year without their presence. Both are missed but we know they are content because they are together in heaven, watching out for us and making sure that we're doing a good job raising our children and their grandchildren. We always called dad the traffic cop because living across from him all those years, he would call every evening telling me that one of the boys left their bicycle outside, or their car windows were rolled down, or he noticed that one of them wasn't home and where were they. He surely loved the boys when they'd take him out for coffee at the donut shop, and my children always called him "Doc", not grandpa, Doc. He was the neighborhood repairman for all the bicycles and skateboards that the children had. He really enjoyed the kids and especially his own grand kids.

Lee was a very large figure in my growing up years. He always be in Grand Haven each summer, closing his practice in Hollywood and coming for a few months. Some times he came alone, some times he brought his wife. One of his marriages was to Delores Casey, she was a movie star. She was to play the part that Vivian Leigh played in Gone with the wind, but she became ill with TB and died. She was pregnant they said at the time. I have some beautiful photo's of her at our home, and also that she had taken when she was in the movies. Lee took that SO hard as he was crazy about her. She came to Grand Haven once when I was about 5 years old. They came at Christmas time to visit.

In 1959, after the birth of Scott, we came to Grand Haven to visit my parents and Lee was here on vacation. He was a dentist out there and had a thriving practice. One night while we were here from Detroit to visit my parents, he took Ken and I to the Red Vest for supper. It was there he told us about his adoption, (which I had known about) and the hurt it had caused him all these years. My brother and I had found his adoption papers in the attic many years before that, but I never said a word to my mom nor Uncle Lee. That night at the Red Vest he poured his heart out, cried and was so emotional over the hurt that was brought upon him by classmates, business people who remembered him as the "door step baby". That was a name that stuck with him right through his adult years up until his death. We wonder today what the requirements were for adoption back in those days, but we suspect like today, there would be an internal investigation and lots of hoops to jump through. He was hours old when he was left on a doorstep close by the home where my grandparents lived. It tells of someone observing this woman standing near a fence with a child in her arms, and hours later when this man went to work, she was gone. It wasn't until the early A.M. hours that he was discovered.

I had never met my grandfather Lee who died in 1917. My grandmother then married Captain Edward E. Martin who came into the marriage with two sons, Clinton and Roland. The fun stories that the four Martin/Wynne children told many years later, I suspect they all had fun growing up together.

Clinton married Three and moved to Milwaukee, he was first mate on the carferry Madison.....they had three children.

Roland Married Viola and he lived in Milwaukee and was Captain of the Milwaukee, the same ferry his dad was Captain of. They had 6 children.

Lee married 5 times but only had one child from his last marriage to Laura. He was very close to Anthony whom they all called Tony. Laura was his medical nurse in the dentist office when they married. She came to Grand Haven a couple of times, she was a lovely gal. Tony lived in Lemon Grove with his mom and new step dad but Lee would have him on weekends or could take him any time he wanted to. He brought Anthony here when Ken and I were married in 1957. He was 3 1/2 at the time. Tony flew here when Lee died in 1971 and stayed for a few days. Such a nice young man. I've spoken to him on the phone several times over the years and had contact with his mother who has given me pictures of him. He's very handsome, tall and thin.

Up until Lee's death, he never could forgive those that hurt him in his growing up years. It was like he was thumbing his nose to all of them because he graduated from a Michigan College, then went on to USC Dental School in California and became a successful dentist. Oh how hurt he would be when he'd recall those younger years. He just couldn't erase those feelings. He also, when drinking, would demand from my mother, wanting to know who his mother and father were. He wanted her to tell him. She told me in later years that it was a man in GH but he was married at the time. The woman supposedly lived here also. One wonders how many times they saw him when he returned here to town each summer time.

I have often wondered throughout the years why he was so bitter, and why SO many people knew about it. I realize that families talk and from one generation to another certainly people would "hear" about his story of being found on a porch/doorstep. It's bothered me so much throughout the years that I finally had to track the source and see for myself.

On February 8, 2005 I went to the Court house with Kristy and was able to get Lee's birth/and death certificate. I then spoke to the county clerk about trying to get his adoption papers. It was she who told me that I would need his death certificate to ask the court. She said I would have to petition the court which I then signed papers to do that. On Feb. 9th, I then went to the Loutit Library here and Kristy and I spent about three hours searching the GH tribune archives on microfilm to find that story about his being left on a doorstep. Sure enough, on the 13th of September 1904, the story was on the front page. It said the mother had been seen early A.M. with a baby in her arms. This was at 4:30 A.M. I will put the newspaper story in his scrapbook here for everyone to read. It's very interesting. They estimated he was 10 days to two weeks old and gave him a birth date of September 4, 1904. It is very easy for me now to understand his hurt.

Grandma and Grandpa Wynne had lost two babies, one perhaps stillborn and a little girl born two years later that lived for 17 days and then died. I suspect the first baby was a miscarriage but the second one lived for that short period of time. She is buried in Allegan. When Lee was found on the doorstep I can only imagine how excited they were. Then to go through the legality of trying to see if they could qualify to take this child into their loving arms. Throughout his years he knew he was loved, however the hurt of his birth was a painful ordeal for him.

My leg struck a sharp track and cut my knee to the bone. I fainted and somehow thought that the man carrying me was my dad and I hugged him. Aunt Sarah wanted to take me to a doctor but a near by nurse said to just bandage it up. However when I got home it was all swollen and black colored. My dad took me to the doctor and he said they might have to amputate my leg unless we could treat it using hot water and carbollic acid three times a day. He said I wasn't to walk on it at all. It finally healed but I still carry the scar." This happened in 1924" .. What a story and isn't she a lucky girl. Heck of a way for a young girl to remember her weeks vacation in Grand Haven--by carrying that scar with her the rest of her life!
